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In this policy, use of the words *school* and *academy* have the same meaning.

Closing Date for Receipt of applications for the forthcoming school year

For admission to secondary schools in 2027, the Government has deemed that the National Closing Date for receipt of applications will be **31st October 2026**.

Parents/carers **must** submit their secondary school application by this date to be considered in the first round of offers made on the National Offer Day – 1st March.

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 Trustees of New Collaborative Learning Trust (NCLT) is the admission authority for its secondary schools – Wingfield Academy, Dinnington High School and Brinsworth Academy. The Trust is responsible for its own admission arrangements and admission policy which the schools follow.
- 1.2 The Trustees of New Collaborative Learning Trust and each school's Local Advisory Body will ensure that:
 - The admission arrangements are reviewed annually. Where relevant changes are made to the policy consultation takes place with all other admission authorities and the Local Authority - Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council (RMBC).
 - Our admission arrangements are determined each year by the 28th February. These are published on each school's website by the 15th March
 - The admission arrangements are made available to parents (Education Act 1996, Section 576) and potential parents.
 - Applications are administered in accordance with this policy.
 - Each term, the number of students on each school roll and reasons for unsuccessful admission appeals will be reported to the Board of Directors/Trustees and Local Advisory Group, advising on any implications.
- 1.3 The Trust will comply with all relevant provisions of the statutory codes of practice (the School Admissions Code of Practice and the School Admission Appeals Code of Practice). The Trust and its schools adhere to requirements of the Equalities Act 2010.
- 1.4 A high-quality educational experience is an entitlement for every student; it is an absolute priority that every student, irrespective of their starting point, succeeds and achieves. Further information about each school can be found on their website and in their Prospectus. Academy open evenings are also held on a regular basis.

NCLT & Secondary School – Admissions coordination

- 1.5 Wingfield Academy, and, including their sixth form provision Dinnington High School and Brinsworth Academy, are secondary schools in Rotherham. The trust also runs three primary schools in the Rotherham area:- Thorpe Hesley Primary, Redscope Primary and Anston Greenlands Primary.
- 1.6 NCLT has agreed to co-ordinate school admission with the local authority, RMBC. Applicants will apply directly to the Local Authority for a school place at Wingfield Academy, Dinnington High School and Brinsworth Academy.

The Rotherham Authority co-ordinates school admissions for both admissions into Year 7 and *in-year* applications. Parents/carers of pupils who are entering their last year of primary education should receive a letter from RMBC, through their child's primary school about transfer to secondary education, including an opportunity to request the preferred school.

Applications are made:-

- online at rotherham.gov.uk/school-admissions
- by requesting a paper/by post application form from Rotherham School Admission Team.

Details are provided in Section 6 below.

Key Date for Year 7 entry

31st October 2026 is the closing date for making an application to join Year 7 in September 2027.

2.0 Admissions Criteria for Wingfield Academy, Dinnington High School and Brinsworth Academy & Published Admission Number

2.1 Published Admission Number

Pupil transfer to secondary school into Year 7, this is called the *relevant year group*. Every Academy/School has to set a limit on the number of pupils that can be admitted each year. This is called the *Published Admission Number*. The Published Admission Number is set annually by the Academy Trust and is the maximum number of pupils that can be admitted to Year 7 in the school. **The published admission number for September 2027, is as follows:**

- Wingfield Academy - 200
- Dinnington High School - 200
- Brinsworth Academy - 270

2.2 Ranking

Places at each school are allocated according to the admission criteria detailed below for a school. The Trust/each school considers all ranking preferences equally, which means that no priority will be given according to the ranking of the preference, except where a potential offer can be made in respect of more than one school as places are available. In these circumstances, the final offer of a place will be made at the highest preferred school available as named on the application form.

2.3 Children with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

Children with an EHCP that names Wingfield Academy, Dinnington High School or Brinsworth Academy in the final Plan will be admitted to that school. The majority of children with special educational needs will not require an Education Health and Care Plan. Applications for children who have special educational needs, but no plan, will be considered on the basis of the school's published admissions criteria, as set out in this policy.

2.4 Oversubscription

If any school receives fewer applications than places available then all pupils will be admitted to the school. If there are more applications than places available, they will be allocated up to the admission number in the *following order of priority*:

- i) Looked after Children and previously Looked after Children. (see note (d) for definition, below)
- ii) Children who, on 31 October of 2026, live in the catchment area of the school and it is expected will have an older sibling on roll in Years 8-13 at the start of the academic year in which they start the school. Each school's catchment area streets are identified in Appendix 1. [see notes (a), (b) and (c) below].
- iii) Children who, on 31 October of 2026, live in the catchment area of the school. A copy of each school's catchment area is available on the school's website. [see notes (a) and (b) below].
- iv) A child who, on 31st October of 2026 it is expected will have an older sibling on the roll of the school in Years 8-13 at the start of the academic year in which they start the school [see note (b) and (c) below].
- v) Children who, on 31 October of 2026, are on the roll of one of the associated primary schools. The associated primary schools are:
 - **Wingfield High School** – Greasbrough, Redscope, Rockingham, Roughwood and Thorpe Hesley
 - **Dinnington High School** - Anston Brook, Anston Greenlands, Anston Park, Dinnington Community Primary School, Laughton Junior & Infant, Laughton All Saints CE, Woodsetts
 - **Brinsworth Academy** - Brinsworth Howarth, Brinsworth Manor, Brinsworth Whitehill, Catcliffe, Whiston, Whiston Worrygoose, Waverley
NOTE - Although many pupils do attend Brinsworth Academy from *Tinsley Primary School*, in Sheffield, the school is not an associated primary school.
- vi) Children of staff at the school meeting the following criteria:
 - The member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made; and/or
 - the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post at the school for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.
- vii) Children who, on 31st October of 2026, live nearest to the school measured by a straight line on a horizontal plane, (commonly known as measurement "as the crow flies"). The measurement is determined by a Geographical Information System, which is based on Ordnance Survey information.

NOTES TO THE OVERSUBSCRIPTION CRITERIA:

a) **Live/living**

This means that a child is habitually and normally resident at an address for a settled purpose which is not solely to receive education. Proof may be required of

residency e.g. documentary evidence of ownership or rental agreement, Council Tax bill, Residence Order, etc.. The Admissions Authority reserves the right to request an affidavit where there is uncertainty regarding a child's ordinary place of residence.

The child's ordinary place of residence will be deemed to be the residential property at which the child normally and habitually resides, with the person(s) having parental responsibility, at the closing date for the receipt of the completed *Common Application Form*. Where residency is split equally between two people with parental responsibility the child's ordinary place of residence will be deemed to be with the person who received Child Benefit on the 31 October 2026.

Where parental responsibility is held by more than one person and those persons reside in separate properties, the child's ordinary place of residence will be deemed to be that property at which the child normally and habitually resides for the greater part of the week including weekends, not solely for the purpose of receiving education.

Places will be allocated based on your residential address on 31 October 2026. Therefore, applicants must notify Rotherham School Admission Team in writing of a change address before this date. Proof of residence (e.g. utility/council tax bill) may be required.

Documentary evidence of ownership or rental agreement may be required together with proof of actual permanent residency at the property concerned.

b) Siblings

For a child to be considered a sibling, one of the following conditions must exist (proof may be required e.g. Birth Certificate and proof of residence):

- Brother/sister to be permanently resident at the same address
- Stepbrother/stepsister to be permanently resident at the same address
- Half-brother/half-sister to be permanently resident at the same address
- Brother/sister who do not live at the same residence but, who share the same parents
- Child of the parent/carer's partner to be permanently resident at the same address
- Adopted brother/sister permanently resident at the same address
- foster brother/sister resident at the same address

c) Y12 Siblings

In the case of Dinnington High School and Brinsworth Academy that have sixth form provision, children with an older brother or sister on the roll of the relevant school will also be considered as having a sibling if the older sibling is in Y12-Y13 at the start of the academic year in which they start at the school.

d) Relevant Looked after Children

A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school. All previously looked after children, (or who became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).

Including those children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care (in the care of or accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation, or any other provider of care whose sole or main purpose is to benefit society) outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.

e) **Multiple births**

Where applications are received for twins, triplets, siblings born in the same academic year etc. these will be treated equally as there is nothing within the admission criteria to distinguish between them.

f) **Tie break**

Where the admission number for the school is likely to be reached mid category, priority will be given to those children who, on 31 October 2026, live nearest to the school measured by a straight line on a horizontal plane (commonly known as measurement, "as the crow flies"). The measurement is determined by a Geographical Information System, which is based on Ordnance Survey information. In the event of distances being the same for two or more children where this would determine the last place to be allocated, random allocation will be carried out and supervised by a person independent of the Admission Authority. All the names will be entered into a hat and the required number of names will be drawn out.

g) **Children of UK service personnel (UK Armed Forces)**

For families of service personnel with a confirmed posting to their area, or crown servants returning from overseas to live in that area, the school will allocate a place in advance of the family arriving in the area provided the application is accompanied by an official letter that declares a relocation date and a Unit postal address or quartering area address. When considering the application against their oversubscription criteria, we will accept a Unit postal address or quartering area address for a service child

h) **Waiting List where the number of applications has exceed the available places in Y7**

Separate to a right of appeal, on the National Offer Day (1 March), the Rotherham School Admission Team will establish a waiting list where the number of applications to a school has exceeded the available places in Year 7. Each over-subscribed school waiting list will rank each child in the order of the oversubscription criteria, set out above, with no reference to the date of the Year 7 admission application. The waiting list will be re-ordered in accordance with the oversubscription criteria whenever anyone is added to or leaves the waiting list. Waiting lists for admission to Year 7 will operate until 31st December 2027.

i) **Admission of children outside their normal age group**

A request may be made for a child to be admitted outside their normal age group, for example if the child is gifted and talented or has experienced problems such as ill health.

Admissions for children outside of the normal age group will follow the process of:-

- Parents will contact the preferred school via email or letter to organise a meeting with the Headteacher
- Parents will be invited to present their reasons for seeking a place outside of the normal age group

- The headteacher will decide as to whether the child's application will be considered as per the normal admissions process
- An email will be forwarded to parents/carers and the local authority outlining the decision and reasons for the decision

Decisions to admit a child outside of their normal age group will be made on the basis of:-

- Parent's views;
- Information about the child's academic, social, and emotional development;
- Where relevant, their medical history and the views of a medical professional;
- Whether they have previously been educated out of their normal age group;
- Whether they may naturally have fallen into a lower age group if it were not for being born prematurely.

Where a school agrees to a parent's request for their child to be admitted out of their normal age group, the child will be admitted to the relevant age group (i.e. the age group to which pupils are normally admitted to the school). The local authority and admission authority will process the application as part of the main admissions round, unless the parental request is made too late for this to be possible, and on the basis of their determined admission arrangements only, including the application of oversubscription criteria where applicable.

j) **Sixth Form (Dinnington High School and Brinsworth Academy)**

The admissions policy and arrangements for the sixth form admissions are the responsibility of the Trust. ***The published admission number for each 6th Form for admission in September 2026 is 25.*** The Admission number refers only to applicants who have not previously attended the school. All students who have attended the school until the end of Year 11 are automatically admitted providing they meet the minimum entry requirements. Parents who wish their child to attend the sixth form at the end of Year 11 should contact the school directly for information and advice. Advice is available on the Sixth Form section of the school website.

3.0 Notification to Parents – National Offer Day

The schools are part of the co-ordinated scheme and all offers of a school place will be made by RMBC, through its Admission Team. On **1st March** prior to the September start, RMBC will send to parents/carers:-

- An email, for online applications which chose 'by email', or
- A letter if parents/carers applied by post or selected this option online.

The notification will identify the name of the school allocated to the child.

4.0 In - Year Admissions - Transferring School During the School Year

a) **What is an in-year application?**

An in-year application is for children requiring a school place during the academic year rather than at the usual transfer time to school.

Contact with the child's current Head Teacher is advised to discuss your intention to apply for another School/Academy place before applying for a school transfer.

Applications must not be made directly to the school. Form / online application is available via the RMBC admissions website. Completed application forms should be returned to the Rotherham School Admission Team who will forward it to our relevant school.

Application forms including more than one child will be considered on an individual child basis. If a child is offered a place in a school, it does not guarantee a place at that school for any other child in the family.

Where a child is not moving to a new house but a school transfer is being made, applicants must complete the in-year school transfer form. Contact may be made with the child's current school on receipt of an application to obtain up-to date information on the child's academic record, attendance and any special needs they may have to assist with the transfer.

Until the transfer arrangements have been approved it is expected that the child will continue to attend their present school.

b) Consideration of in-year transfers

Admissions will normally be agreed up to the published admission number (PAN) which applied for the normal year (Year 7) of intake or the current admission number (CAN). The current admission number is the maximum number of pupils we can accommodate in each year group based on the class organisation and size within the school for each academic year.

c) Admission Numbers

The **Published Admission Number** for admission into Year 7 in September 2027 is:-

- Wingfield Academy - 200
- Dinnington High School - 200
- Brinsworth Academy – 270

The **Current Admission Number**, for in-year admissions in 2027-2028 for the older year groups is:

- Wingfield Academy - Year 8 - 200, Year 9 - 200, Year 10 - 200, Year 11 – 200
- Dinnington High School - Year 8 - 190, Year 9 - 190, Year 10 - 190, Year 11 – 190
- Brinsworth Academy - Year 8 - 245, Year 9 - 245, Year 10 - 245, Year 11 – 245

Parents may wish to contact the school, before submitting an application, to check on the availability of places.

Note - The Admissions Code 2021 allows, under Section 3.10, an admission authority to refuse admission for a pupil with challenging behaviour and to refer the child to the Local Authority Fair Access Panel. This provision can only be used where the school has a high proportion of either other children with challenging behaviour or previously excluded pupils and it considers admitting the pupil would prejudice the provision of efficient education or efficient use of resources.

d) Applying for a place in year 10 or year 11

Performance and level of achievement/attainment are adversely affected each time a child experiences a transfer to a new school. Avoidable and unnecessary changes should be carefully considered and parents need to be aware of the consequence of moving schools in key groups such as year 10 and year 11.

It may be difficult to offer courses compatible with your previous school. However, schools/academies are not able to refuse to admit children because they followed a different curriculum at their previous school.

e) Application Forms

An in-year *School Transfer Form* should be submitted. An in-year *School Transfer Form* is available on line and, in hard copy, from the Rotherham School Admission Team (see Section 6 below for details).

f) Moving to a new address

Applications should be made in advance of the move to reduce the risk of the child being out of school while the application is processed. Proof of your new address will be requested.

g) Timescales

The Rotherham School Admission Team will record all in-year transfer applications and will forward application via secure email to your preferred school for consideration.

Our schools aim to respond within 10 school days to transfer school. **Schools are required to respond to all in-year transfer requests within a maximum of 15 school days from date of receipt of the application.**

Parents will receive a letter in writing confirm the outcome of their application. Where it is not possible to offer a school/academy place will be informed of their 'Right of Appeal' and advised how to make an appeal. The RMBC has established an independent Appeals Panel which is used by the Trust to hear appeals. **Appeals must be made within 20 school days of receipt of a refusal letter.** Appeal forms and guidance notes are available from the Rotherham School Admission Team.

It is not possible to process any applications during school holidays. Applications will be considered as soon as the school re-opens.

In-year applications may be made up to one term in advance of the requested starting at the preferred school. Parents seeking a transfer of school in the following September can apply from the 1st May onwards. Any application for admission in the

following September which is received prior to this date will be put on hold and considered as having been received on 1st May.

5.0 Information on Appeals

Where it is not possible to offer your child a place at the school you have applied for, you will receive a letter advising you of the reasons for this decision. This will usually be sent on behalf of the Board of Directors (as the Admissions Authority) by Rotherham School Admission Team.

All parents/carers have the right of appeal to an independent appeal panel if you have received written confirmation that it has not been possible to offer your child a place at the schools you have applied for.

All independent appeals are organised by an Appeals Clerk at Rotherham MBC. Appeals follow procedures set out in legislation and the School Admission Appeals Code of Practice. The Appeals Clerk, Panel and process are independent of the Admissions Authority.

Important requirements to note are:

- Appeals must be in writing stating the grounds on which the appeal is made;
- every parent has the right to attend the independent appeal in order to make their case;
- the parent can be accompanied by a friend or be represented by them;
- independent appeals are heard in private;
- the decision of the Appeals Panel is binding on both parents and the Admissions Authority;
- parents will receive written notification of the Appeals Panel decision.
- Dates – (parents will be advised at the earliest opportunity of appeal dates by the Clerk)

A separate document containing details of the appeals procedure is available from RMBC to parents whose applications could not be satisfied. Any member of the Authority may attend, as an observer, any hearing by an Independent Appeal Panel established by the Authority.

Parents will be given at least 14 days written notice of the date, time and place of the appeal hearing and will receive prior to the appeal, written documentation summarising the reasons for refusing the admission. If a parent does not attend the appeal or is not represented by another person the hearing may be held and the case dealt with in the absence of the parent using only the written documentation submitted.

In some cases, parents who are not successful at the appeal occasionally consider applying again for the same school in the same academic year. Unless there has been a significant and material change of circumstances which is relevant to the application for admission, the admission authority (NCLT) is not required to reconsider its decision and therefore parents do not have the right of another appeal.
